Ms. Robinson called attention to the Student Academic Standards Committee annual report. With objection, the report was filed.

Ms. Robinson called attention to the Administrative Procedures Committee annual report. With an error in addition corrected, the report was filed.

Ms. Robinson called attention to the University Curriculum Committee monthly report. Without objection, the report was filed.

Ms. Robinson called attention to the Digital Information Literacy proposal. Ms. Robison and Ms. Derenne presented on the proposal's development. The adding of this requirement was directed by the State Board of Education. It was explained to the Senate how this requirement can be added to our Essential Studies program without increasing credit hours to the students program of study. Ms. Smart moved to approve. Mr. Milavetz seconded. A discussion with questions ensued. The motion to approve carried.

Ms. Robinson announced the Committee ballot was sent then rescinded this week. It will be reissued in the near future.

Ms. Borboa-Pederson presented on the degree conferral for Hilyard James Duty. Ms. Borboa-Pederson discussed Mr. Duty's academic history at UND. After review, he was awarded a degree retroactively. His name will be included in the graduation list next month.

Ms. Pederson updated the senate on the College of College Faculties. The CCF will continue with three representatives for this upcoming year. The post-tenue review process continues. The NDUS research universities have a good process and should share processes and best practices. Please share additional feedback with Ms. Pederson.

Ms. Nelson provided a Student Government update. Election day is coming up next month. Student Government resolutions were passed to support SBHE gambling laws and support DUO authentication for Blackboard.

Mr. Link provided updates from Academic Affairs. Mr. Link discussed the post-tenue review report. The first draft suggested mandates to UND faculty to serve on other institutions review boards. That requirement has been removed. The FAFSA revision has delayed data arrival at higher education institutions. We have only received one student's data to date. This affects all institutions in the United States. UND Connect has been announced. Check your email inboxes. The Office of Accessibility has been transitioned from Student Affairs to Academic Affairs. It will be renamed in the future. There will be an establishment of an Office of Leadership Development targeted at undergraduate and graduate students.

Mr. Jendrysik asked about what will become of the vacant land across University where the residence halls were demolished. Ms. Alberts asked about bring the ES program review to senate.
