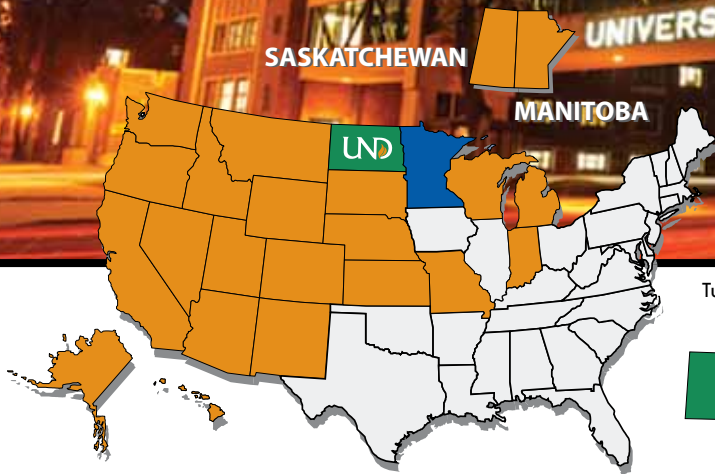




How Much Will It Cost?

This is a general estimate of student expenses during a nine-month college year, based on **2011-12** costs. Our Cost Estimator is also available at www.und.edu/admissions/enrollment. All charges are subject to change and do not include personal expenses, flight/aviation expenses, or various course fees (lab, etc.). Tuition is based on a flat rate for full-time students (12-20 credits/semester).

Scholarships

Good grades pay off

Each year, UND awards millions of dollars in academic scholarships to incoming freshman students and transfer students. Apply early for top consideration! Priority will be given to students based on postmark date of their application. Students who are admitted by the priority dates are automatically considered for the following scholarship programs at the time of admission.

Students may accept non-UND scholarships without jeopardizing the amount of their UND scholarship. Some of UND's academic departments also offer additional scholarships. For more information contact the departments directly.

The Student Financial Aid Office assists students and their families in meeting the costs of higher education by providing students with financial assistance and by providing families with access to options and information on financial planning to help students achieve their educational goals.

What Money Is Available to Help Pay My Expenses?

Financial aid is intended to supplement the financial contributions from the student and family. Students are offered financial assistance in various forms, including scholarships, grants, employment and loan programs. Grants, Employment & Loans

UND participates in numerous state and federal financial aid programs including, ND State Grant, Federal Pell Grant, Federal TEACH Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG), Federal Work-Study (FWS), Federal Perkins Loan, Federal Direct Loans, and Federal Direct PLUS and Grad PLUS Loans. How Do I Apply for Financial Aid?

The **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** is the only application required for all federal and state financial aid at the University of North Dakota. The FAFSA provides a standardized method of determining eligibility for financial assistance. The amount of financial need is the difference between the amount the federal government expects you and your family to contribute to your education and the cost of attending UND.

Apply early! Complete the FAFSA as soon after January 1 as possible. The priority date for state and federal financial aid programs is April 15, 2012 for the 2012-13 academic year.

Cultural Diversity Tuition Waiver and other Scholarship programs

Steps to Apply for Financial Aid

Step 1: Apply for Admission to UND

After you have applied for admission, you will receive a User ID, Student ID number, and a University e-mail address (U-Mail). All official correspondence from UND will be sent to this e-mail address.

Step 2: Apply for Scholarships

You will be automatically considered for academic honor scholarships when you have been admitted. Other scholarship and tuition waiver programs require a separate application. Application information for these programs is available at www.und.edu/financial-aid. Please note priority dates!

Step 3: Apply for Financial Aid

Complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at www.fafsa.gov. UND's school code for the FAFSA is 003005. The FAFSA should be submitted by March 1 to ensure that it is processed by the North Dakota priority date of April 15.

Step 4: You Receive a SAR

After you submit your FAFSA you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR is a summary of the information that you provided on the FAFSA. Review the SAR carefully! Corrections can be made at www.fafsa.gov.

Step 5: You Receive a Notification of Financial Aid Awards

New freshmen and transfer students will receive notification of their financial aid awards soon after their FAFSA is processed. Official award notifications will be sent to your U-Mail account. You can estimate your financial aid eligibility at any time by using our online Financial Aid Estimator at www.und.edu/admission/enrollment or www.und.edu/financial-aid.

Step 6: Complete Paperwork for a Direct Student Loan

If you have accepted a Direct Loan, you must complete a Master Promissory Note and Entrance Loan Counseling at www.studentloans.gov.

Step 7: Apply for Additional Assistance if Necessary

If you require more financial assistance than appears on your award notification, you may be eligible to apply for other loans: Federal Direct Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS), Minnesota SELF Loan, Federal Direct GradPLUS, or Private Educational Loans.
