Research

UND's sponsored research programs had a state and regional economic impact of \$239.5 million in FY2011, an increase of \$21.8 million over the previous year. The University's research activity in FY2011 resulted in 2,021 jobs, including more than 990 at UND. Also of the jobs resulting from UND sponsored programs 1,759 jobs were within North Dakota. UND research activity generated about \$23.6 million in federal and state tax revenue in FY2011. UND's economic impact on the state and region is close to \$1 billion a year.
