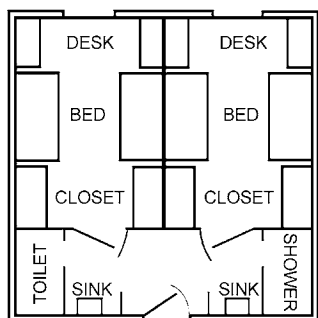
# Living at UND

## Bath Arrangements

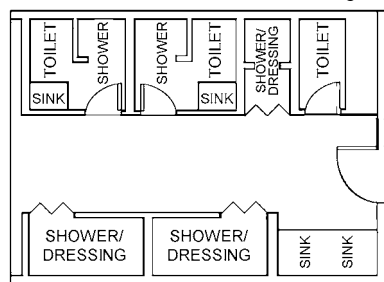
### Suite Bathrooms

Designed for two or three rooms to share an adjacent bathroom with a shower, two sinks and a toilet. Find this bath arrangement in these halls: West, McVey, Noren, Selke, Brannon, Squires and Walsh.



### Private Bathrooms in Community Clusters

Not your traditional "community baths." Recently renovated spaces offer a shower, toilet and sink enclosed with a door that shuts and locks. Outside of the private space are several sinks and large mirrors. These halls have this bath arrangement: Conference Center,



Johnstone, Fulton, Smith, Bek and Hancock.

**Private baths** are designed with a toilet, shower, and sink in the residents' room.

This bath arrangement can be found in Swanson Hall.

## Additional Services & Amenities

### Tunnels:

Each hall within each complex is connected by a tunnel. Exceptions are Swanson, which is connected to the Student Union and the Conference Center which is located across University Avenue from Swanson Hall. The complex tunnels or skywalk also connect halls to the dining center and service centers.

### Residential Dining

Dining Services is committed to preparing well-balanced and reasonably priced meals that fit busy schedules. Residence hall students are required to select a meal plan. Students may eat in any of three dining centers on campus located in Wilkerson Hall, Squires Hall and the Memorial Union (Terrace Dining Center). Weekend meals are only served in Wilkerson. A convenience store is located in each complex. Wilkerson and Squires Dining Centers offer a To-Go Café. Meal plans may be used for breakfast and lunch at the Wings Café (Aerospace building at the airport).

## Meal Plan Options

\* Unlimited Access Plus includes \$150 Dining Dollars and 12 guest passes per semester

\* Unlimited Access includes \$50 Dining Dollars and 3 guest passes per semester

### Block plans are available to transfer or returning students only

Block Plan #1: 125 meals and \$400 dining dollars per semester

Block Plan #2: 155 meals and \$150 dining dollars per semester

Block plan meals do not expire at the end of the week; they are good until the end of the semester.

Block plan meals are not restricted by meal zones.

## Dining Dollars

All meal plans include a certain amount of Dining Dollars which can be used in all campus retail dining outlets and dining centers throughout the day. Dining Dollars expire if not used by the end of each semester.

### How Do I Apply?

Students requesting residence hall accommodations are required to complete the application and pay the \$35 non-refundable housing application fee. You may apply by paper process or online. Apply early. Applications are accepted up to one year prior to occupancy.

#### Step 1: Apply for residence halls

To apply by paper process, complete the application on page 1 and return it with the \$35 fee by postal mail.

To apply online, go to [www.housing.und.edu](http://www.housing.und.edu) for more information. Be ready to indicate your hall preferences and pay your \$35 application fee by E-check or credit card.

#### Step 2: Commit to your housing

You will be asked to commit to your residence hall housing by signing the Room and Board License Contract and paying the \$250 first installment. You can complete Step 2 online or by paper process. When the contract is ready, you may print it off the housing website, sign and return it by postal mail or fax to 701-777-4298. ### Room Assignment Process

Residence hall room assignments are made on a first-come, first served basis, according to the date the \$35 non-refundable housing application fee and completed housing application are received. Students are ready to be assigned to a residence hall room when the Housing Office receives all four items listed below:

1. A completed housing application
2. The \$35 non-refundable housing application fee
3. A signed Room & Board Contract for the semester requesting housing
4. First installment payment

Fall semester room assignments are emailed to students beginning in late May and continue until the residence halls open in August. Spring semester room assignments are emailed to students in early December.

#### Cancellations

Students may cancel their residence hall application at any time BEFORE they have signed the Room and Board Contract. After a student has signed his/her Room and Board Contract, he/she is advised to read their contract carefully before canceling. After the first installment has been paid, approved Room and Board Contract cancellations will result in a cancellation fee. ### Apartment-Style Housing

University Place is an apartment-style housing option for students with 30 or more post-high school credits. Located on University Avenue, the units offer furnished living rooms, bedrooms, and a full kitchen with refrigerator, stove and microwave. Each unit will house four students with either single or double occupancy bedrooms.

### Apartment Housing

UND manages approximately 875 apartments for student families and single students. Currently enrolled students with 90 credits or 23 years of age (in the calendar year) or older are eligible for student apartments. Hamline Square apartment leaseholders must be 21 years of age (in the calendar year) or older. You may apply and remain on the waiting list until you are eligible for assignment.
