Grade Scale:

- ‘A’ Student** Exemplary student. This student fulfills all contractual obligations with the highest degree of professionalism and evidences a sophisticated, substantive, and self-aware practical knowledge in the final reflective assignment, with minimal technical errors.
- ‘B’ Student** Above average student. This student *exceeds* expectations. Same as above, with increased errors in the final product, or very minor neglects with respect to the contractual obligations.
- ‘C’ Student** Average student. This student just *meets* expectations by fulfilling contractual obligations and submitting a very basic, mostly unoriginal or somewhat unedited reflective/research piece.
- ‘D’ Student** Below average student. This student *does not meet* expectations. This student was somewhat unprofessional; did not meet at least 30% of contractual obligations; failed to turn in assignments; or turned in sloppy work.
- ‘F’ Student** This student completely failed to live up to the established contract, and/or was highly unprofessional, and/or did not turn in a final assignment as required, and/or committed plagiarism in the final reflective piece.
