### Dean, School of Law

The University of North Dakota is seeking candidates for the position of Dean of the School of Law. Reporting directly to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Dean is the leader of the state's only law school. The Dean will provide leadership and facilitate an environment for accomplishing strategic goals, as well as aligning the functioning of the School of Law with UND's broader academic integrity and strategic planning: UND LEADS. The dean is responsible, in cooperation with the Provost, for the academic and administrative planning; budgeting; administration and implementation of school and university policies; and fundraising and external relations. The Dean, in partnership with the faculty, is responsible for academic program development and review; faculty and staff recruitment; development and evaluation of faculty; and student relations.

UND seeks an exceptional, focused, and creative leader who will build upon the School of Law's strengths to continue its growth and expansion, provide world-class educational experiences, recruit and develop outstanding faculty, and promote faculty-driven scholarly and creative endeavors within the school. The next Dean will be a committed team player who is devoted to excellence and shared governance. The selected individual will be a consultative decision-maker and will work collaboratively with faculty, staff, students, administrators, and community and industry partners. The Dean will have unquestioned integrity and exemplary interpersonal and communication skills.

The anticipated stating date of the new Dean will be July 1, 2026, or as soon as reasonable thereafter.

### THE SCHOOL OF LAW AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA



Established in 1899, the University of North Dakota School of Law is a public law school, located on the main campus of the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks. The UND School of Law has more than 3,000 alumni and an annual total enrollment of approximately 250 students, with over half of the students coming from North Dakota and the rest coming from Minnesota, across the nation, and Canada.

Enrollment is rising in the School of Law. In fall 2025, the School will welcome its largest incoming first-year class in 30 years. The School of Law offers the J.D. degree; an accelerated law degree; and joint degree programs in law and public administration (J.D./M.P.A.), law and business administration (J.D./M.B.A.), and law and public health (J.D./M.P.H.) In addition, the School of Law offers three certificate programs: one in Indian and Tribal Law;

one in Aviation Law; and one in Energy, Environment, and Natural Resources. The School of Law is also home to the Northern Plains Indian Law Center and is nationally recognized for its excellence in Indian and Tribal Law, as well as law in rural settings.

As the only School of Law in the state of North Dakota, the School plays the leading role in the preparation of students for participation across the entire spectrum of law-related professions in North Dakota and throughout the region. The School of Law has been accredited by the American Bar Association since 1923 and has been a member of the Association of American Law Schools since 1911. The School maintains very close ties with the judiciary and practicing bar of the state of North Dakota, of which approximately 80 percent of the judiciary and 75 percent of the practicing attorneys are alumni.





The University of North Dakota is seeking candidates for the position of Dean of the UND School of Law. Reporting directly to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Dean is the chief executive officer of the School of Law and is responsible for its effective administration. The Dean will provide leadership and facilitate an environment for accomplishing strategic goals, as well as aligning the functioning of the School of Law with UND's broader academic identity and strategic planning. The Dean is responsible, in cooperation with the Provost, for academic and administrative planning; budgeting; administration and implementation of department, school, and university policies; and fund-raising and external relations. The Dean, in partnership with the faculty, is responsible for academic program development and review; faculty recruitment; development and evaluation of faculty; and student relations. The Dean should secure and develop relationships with key stakeholders of the School of Law, including alumni, supporters, and members of North Dakota's legal community.

UND seeks a dynamic and visionary leader who will build upon the School of Law's strengths to provide exceptional professional educational experiences, recruit and develop outstanding faculty, and promote faculty-driven scholarly and creative endeavors. The next Dean will be a committed team player who is devoted to excellence and shared governance. The selected individual will be a consultative decision-maker and will work collaboratively with faculty, staff, students, and administrators. The next Dean should have a keen understanding of the changes facing the legal profession and legal education and be able to develop a future-oriented vision of the Law School's contributions to national and state legal institutions in this shifting and dynamic landscape. The Dean will have unquestioned integrity and exemplary interpersonal and communication skills.

The next Dean of the UND School of Law will be joining the University during a dynamic period. Under the leadership of President Andrew Armacost (who joined UND in 2020) and Provost Eric Carl Link (who joined UND in 2021), the campus is experiencing enrollment growth and major campus improvements with several buildings currently under construction and/or renovation. Significant investments in terms of research development in critical areas are propelling the University forward as the flagship research institution in the state of North Dakota. Meanwhile, the University's ongoing commitment to student success at both the undergraduate and graduate levels continues to elevate the tradition of educational excellence at the institution.

The incoming Dean of the School of Law will have the opportunity to build on the long-standing tradition of excellence within the School; to work alongside both internal and external partners and stakeholders to increase and enhance the mission of the School; and to lead the School through a period of enrollment growth, program expansion, and increasing visibility across the state of North Dakota. Enhancing access and opportunity for students and faculty through alumni and donor relations will be essential in the coming years as the University engages in robust capital campaigning and relationship building, as will bringing key programmatic opportunities to the students of the school that will position them — and the School — for ongoing service to the state and the region.

The following is an abbreviated list of the responsibilities associated with this position:

- Fostering collaborative academic planning and innovative curricular development.
- · Promoting student success and retention.

- Attracting support for the University and the School through active engagement of alumni, community, industry, and other external constituents, and effectively participating in fundraising activities/alumni relations.
- · Maintaining accreditation standards.
- Managing the budget in accordance with the University's Model for Incentive Resource Allocation, including the preparation, submission, disbursement of, and working within the budget of the School.
- In collaboration with others, creating and supporting a plan that results in the recruitment and retention of highly qualified staff and faculty.
- Leading the coordination of School governance.
- Maintaining and strengthening partnerships within and outside of the University.
- Building relationships that engender trust through open communication across the campus and within the staff.





### **Minimum Requirements**

- · A Juris Doctor (J.D.) or other terminal degree in law.
- At least six years of accomplishments in progressive and increasingly complex leadership roles in higher education, the practice of law, or a related field.
- · At least ten years of teaching or professional experience in law.
- · Licensed to practice law in any jurisdiction in the United States.

### **Preferred Qualifications**

- At least seven years of accomplishments in progressive and increasingly complex leadership roles in higher education, the practice of law, or a related field.
- A record of excellence and achievement in teaching, service, and scholarship in the legal academy or an outstanding record of accomplishment in the practice of law or the judiciary that demonstrates a level of intellectual leadership and accomplishment that would qualify the candidate for holding a tenured faculty position within the School of Law.
- Experience creating innovative approaches that provide faculty and staff with the resources to support, maintain, and enhance excellence in teaching, scholarship, and student support.
- Experience working closely and collaboratively with executive leadership teams and establishing strong working relationships with key internal and external stakeholders, such as alumni, the judiciary, and local state bar associations and legislative governing bodies.
- Proficiency with data and data analytics to assist in strategic decision making.
- Experience overseeing recruitment, hiring, retention, supervision, and mentorship of high-quality faculty and staff or equivalent experience recruiting, retaining, and supervising employees.
- Experience with fundraising and identification of creative and atypical revenue streams, securing external support, and building donor relationships.
- A record of sound budgetary management with good financial acumen.
- Dedication to working with, understanding, and addressing the needs of nontraditional and underrepresented students and other historically underserved populations.
- · Experience with, or knowledge of, the accreditation processes.
- Proven record of providing direction and advocacy for research and creative endeavors.
- Demonstrated leadership in fostering community, belonging, and consensus among diverse groups.
- Experience with academic administration of the promotion and tenure process, faculty hiring and appointments.

- Be an effective agent of positive change with the ability to motivate and inspire others to support and engage in proactive and visionary change.
- Have an appreciation for and proactively involve others in the shared governance process that exists between the law school's administration and its faculty, staff, and students.
- Have a commitment to fostering community, belonging, and consensus building in faculty, staff, and student populations.
- Have interpersonal skills that lead to respectful and effective interactions both inside and outside the University.
- Have a deep commitment to student learning and a positive student experience.
- Be a strategic, critical thinker who leads with candor, sound judgment, empathy, and transparency.
- Demonstrates high integrity and emotional intelligence, as well as a commitment to high professional standards and ethics.

### **Opportunities & Challenges**

- Positioning UND School of Law students for success with the new NextGen Bar Exam, which has been adopted in North Dakota and will be administered beginning July of 2027.
- Leading the School of Law forward in a swiftly evolving technological landscape that will have far-reaching impacts on legal education and the legal profession.
- Addressing the ongoing workforce needs of the state of North Dakota in the legal professions, particularly in rural regions in the state.
- Maintaining and strengthening the robust relationship between the School of Law and the state's judiciary, Bar Association, and legislature.
- Responding to legislative initiatives, such as expanding experiential learning opportunities and legal clinics.



Consistently recognized as a "best value law school," the UND School of Law ranks in the top ten law schools with the least amount of student debt.

### **School of Medicine & Health Sciences**

As the state's only medical school, UND educates the majority of North Dakota's family physicians and other healthcare professionals. It's ranked in the Top 5 in the nation for most graduates practicing rural medicine by U.S. News & World Report. The School also created the world's first Ph.D. in Indigenous Health, a groundbreaking program advancing equity and health outcomes for Indigenous communities.

### College of Nursing & Professional Disciplines

Meeting critical workforce needs in nursing, nutrition and social work, UND prepares compassionate, practice-ready professionals through nationally ranked programs. Its simulation and clinical training facilities provide hands-on experience, while flexible online options expand access for rural and working professionals. UND nursing graduates consistently achieve licensure exam pass rates above national averages and are recognized for excellence in patient care and community impact.

The University of North Dakota is a Carnegie R1: Very High Research Activity institution — a designation shared with only 187 universities nationwide and representing about 4.7% of the nearly 4,000 degree-granting institutions in the nation. UND reported more than \$192 million in annual research expenditures and secured over \$150 million in external research awards each year, placing it firmly among the nation's top research universities.

UND's success is further strengthened by state investments in national security and economic diversification research, ensuring UND faculty and students have the resources to drive innovation.

### **The Grand Challenges**

UND has defined six Grand Challenges that help diversify North Dakota's economy and address social issues.

### **Autonomous Systems**


UND is a global leader in unmanned and autonomous technologies, advancing innovations that span ground, air, maritime and space systems. Through the Research Institute for Autonomous Systems (RIAS) and the first Center for Unmanned Aircraft Systems Research, Education & Training in the nation, UND collaborates with the FAA, Department of War and NASA to develop next-generation technologies for safety, communication and human–machine teaming. The University's work in beyond-visual-line-of-sight flight, detect-and-avoid systems and Al-driven autonomy positions North Dakota as a national hub for this rapidly expanding industry.

### **Computational & Data Science**

UND is harnessing the power of big data, artificial intelligence and high-performance computing to solve real-world challenges. The Computational Research Center supports projects ranging from climate modeling and digital agriculture to defense analytics and cybersecurity. Recent collaborations include the development of Al-driven predictive systems for Arctic operations and advanced machine learning applications in unmanned systems. With new investments in research computing infrastructure and partnerships across academia, government and industry, UND is building the capacity to turn data into discovery and insight that drives progress for North Dakota and beyond.

### **Energy & Environmental Sustainability**

UND is advancing energy innovation and environmental responsibility through interdisciplinary research that strengthens both North Dakota's economy and global energy security. The Energy & Environmental Research Center (EERC) and Institute for Energy Studies lead initiatives in carbon capture, enhanced oil recovery, hydrogen power, renewable energy and battery storage. Faculty are pioneering ways to extract rare-earth elements from lignite coal, reducing U.S. dependence on foreign suppliers, while also improving wind energy and smart grid technologies. With one of the nation's largest university-based energy enterprises and deep partnerships across industry and government, UND is shaping the future of clean, affordable and sustainable energy.





### **Human Health**

UND is tackling today's most pressing health challenges through discovery, innovation and collaboration. UND's School of Medicine & Health Sciences leads research that improves the quality of life for North Dakotans and beyond, addressing diseases such as Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, stroke, cancer and addiction. The University hosts one of only six USDA Human Nutrition Research Centers in the nation and has secured continuous NIH Centers of Biomedical Research Excellence (COBRE) funding for more than 15 years. UND researchers are advancing understanding in neuroscience, infectious disease and epigenetics, while pioneering partnerships that connect clinical practice, public health and translational science to deliver real-world impact.

### **National Security & Space**

UND is advancing the nation's defense and space capabilities through cutting-edge research, workforce development and strategic partnerships. The University's National Security Initiative (NSI) builds capacity in autonomy, space operations, medicine and energy — supported by millions in new UND investments and state funding for space-related research infrastructure. A new Nanofoundry for national security materials is developing advanced thin films for secure communications and quantum computing, while the College of Engineering & Mines has been designated a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Research (CAE-R) through 2029. UND's collaborations with the U.S. Space Force, Space Command and the Department of War position North Dakota as a hub for next-generation national security innovation.

### **Rural Health & Communities**

North Dakota leads national efforts to improve health outcomes and quality of life in rural and tribal communities. Through the Center for Rural Health, the Behavioral Health Initiative and the Department of Indigenous Health, UND addresses barriers to care, behavioral health needs and workforce shortages across the region. The School of Medicine & Health Sciences anchors these efforts through partnerships with more than 1,200 clinical faculty statewide. UND's research and outreach programs build healthier, more resilient communities across North Dakota and beyond.







As an integral part of life at UND, our Fighting Hawks athletic teams foster school spirit, community pride and national recognition.

- UND competes in 17 NCAA Division I sports, offering student-athletes opportunities to excel on the field and in the classroom.

### **Chester Fritz Library Renovations (2021)**

Updated entrances, technology and study spaces.

### Gershman Graduate Center (2021)

Dedicated space for graduate students.

### **Memorial Union (2021)**

An \$80 million student hub, nationally recognized for facility design.

### Nistler College of Business & Public Administration (2022)

A \$70 million state-of-the-art building made possible through public-private partnership and generous alumni support.

### Residence Hall Renewal (2023)

Two new halls (West and McVey) and renovation of Brannon Hall, enhancing the student living experience.

### Carnegie and Merrifield Halls (2025)

Renovated historic buildings now featuring modern technology, accessibility and collaborative spaces.









### **Major Upcoming Projects**

### Flight Operations Building & Hangar (2025–26)

A \$36 million, 28,000-square-foot aerospace facility at Grand Forks International Airport, fully funded by private donors.

### STEM Complex (2027)

A 179,000-square-foot facility replacing Hyslop Sports Center, designed for interdisciplinary teaching and research across STEM fields, robotics and esports.

Together, these projects reflect UND's strong partnerships with students, alumni, donors and the state, ensuring the campus remains a place of innovation, excellence and belonging for future generations.




The University of North Dakota operates with a commitment to transparency, accountability and strategic investment. Annual revenues reflect a balanced mix of state support, tuition, federal grants and private philanthropy.

UND's **Model for Incentive-Based Resource Allocation** (MIRA) ensures that resources are aligned with the University's mission and priorities. The model emphasizes:

- · Clarity and fairness in distributing funds.
- · Incentives for innovation and efficiency.
- Strategic investments that strengthen teaching, research and student success.

This approach empowers colleges and schools to plan for growth while maintaining UND's values of responsibility, trust and long-term sustainability. ### UND'S ECONOMIC IMPACT & STATEWIDE ROLE

As the state's flagship and most comprehensive research university, UND serves as North Dakota's chief opportunity engine. With more than \$1.48 billion in annual economic impact, UND fuels business activity, supports nearly 10,000 jobs and generates millions in state and local tax revenue.

UND's contributions reach far beyond its campus:

**Workforce Development:** UND is the primary center for professional education and training in the state, educating the majority of North Dakota's physicians, attorneys, engineers, teachers and business leaders.

**Energy Leadership:** The Energy & Environmental Research Center (EERC) and the College of Engineering & Mines drive advances in carbon capture, enhanced oil recovery and the commercialization of rare-earth minerals — making UND a key player in the nation's energy future.

Diversification & Innovation: UND helps expand North Dakota's economy through pioneering work in unmanned aircraft systems, autonomous technologies and national security research, partnering with agencies such as the FAA, Department of War, Department of Homeland Security and NASA. The new UND CONNECT program — funded by the N.D. Economic Diversification Research Grant — is a faculty-led program that fosters partnerships and delivers local impact through student learning.

**Regional Partnerships:** The Division of Research & Economic Development works closely with city, state and regional economic development groups, including targeted initiatives to grow the UAS sector and attract new industries to the state.

Through education, research and collaboration, UND strengthens North Dakota's economy while addressing challenges of national and global importance.

With a growing population of nearly 800,000 residents, North Dakota is a state of opportunity, combining economic strength with an exceptional quality of life.

### **Economic Engines**

North Dakota is a national leader in energy and agriculture. The state ranks among the top producers of oil and natural gas and is the third-leading energy producer in the nation. The Legacy Fund, a multibillion-dollar savings account created from energy revenues, ensures future prosperity for residents.

The state also leads the nation in the production of spring wheat, beans, canola, flaxseed and honey, while a growing manufacturing sector supports food processing and agricultural equipment. North Dakota also has emerged as a hub for unmanned aerial systems (UAS), one of the fastest-growing industries, supported by strong public-private partnerships.

### **Tourism & Natural Beauty**

Tourism is the state's third-largest industry, highlighted by the Badlands and Theodore Roosevelt National Park, the historic town of Medora (future home of the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library) and the International Peace Garden. Residents and visitors alike enjoy abundant opportunities for hunting, fishing, hiking and year-round outdoor recreation across North Dakota's 20 state parks and recreation areas.
