OVERALL SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The AISS program has developed a solid assessment system that is well-implemented. The prevailing assessment is a student survey which employs terms suvh as "awareness" and "understanding" that tend to be ambiguous and may make results difficult to interpret. It would be interesting see what students in focus groups might say if asked to speak specifically about how awareness or understanding gets applied in their lives. Use of focus groups was mentioned as a method in the annual report but we did not see findings and so are not sure how and when this method is used.
