

Research

UND obtained more than \$152M in total external awards in FY2023, including over \$106M in research awards. In FY2022, UND's reported research expenditures totaled over \$147M and are anticipated to be nearly \$170M in FY2023. More than \$62M of those FY2022 expenditures were from federal sources — over \$17M higher than any other NDUS institution — including the Department of Energy, Nation Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation, and the Department of Defense, among others. UND research expenditures supported the training of hundreds of undergraduate and graduate students in research projects.

NDUS Report on Economic Impact

As the chief opportunity engine for North Dakota and North Dakotans, the University of North Dakota is the state's most comprehensive intensive research university and the primary center for professional education and training. UND's economic impact on that state and region is \$1.48 billion. Levels of business activity resulting from UND expenditures and spending by students supported secondary employment of 4,663 jobs in FY2021.

UND also impacts the state's economy through its students and alumni. Seventy-nine percent of family medicine physicians practicing in North Dakota either graduated from the UND School of Medicine & Health Sciences or completed an in-state residency.* Additionally, UND has educated a significant number of the engineers and oil and gas experts working in the oil industry that is so critical to the state's economic health.


