The above data is based upon the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), which collects and compares retention and graduation rates of first-time, full-time degree/certificate-seeking students. Students who graduate within their first year are considered 'retained/continued' to their 2nd year and any student who continues with a graduate/professional program without a completed bachelor's program are considered retained.

IPEDS excludes the following students: students who start at UND, transfer to another institution, and graduate; and students who start elsewhere (e.g., one of the North Dakota's two-year institutions) and graduates from UND. Additional allowable exclusions include students who left UND for the following reasons: to serve in the armed forces; to serve with a foreign aid service of the Federal Government (e.g., Peace Corps); to serve on official church missions; or died or were totally and permanently disabled.
