## **Being Active in Your Efforts**

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Conduct a comprehensive assessment of the circumstances of the Indian child's family, with a focus on safe reunification as the most desirable goal;
Identify appropriate services and help the parents to overcome barriers, including actively assisting the parents in obtaining such services;
Identifying, notifying, and inviting representatives of the Indian child's Tribe to participate in providing support and services to the Indian child's family and in family team meetings, permanency planning, and resolution of placement issues;
Conducting or causing to be conducted a <b>diligent search</b> for the Indian child's extended family members, and contacting and <b>consulting with extended family members</b> to provide family <b>structure and support</b> for the Indian child and the Indian child's parents;
Offering and employing all available and culturally appropriate family preservation strategies and facilitating the use of remedial and rehabilitative services provided by the child's Tribe;
Taking steps to keep siblings together whenever possible;
Supporting regular visits with parents or Indian custodians in the most natural setting possible as well as trial home visits of the Indian child during any period of removal, consistent with the need to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the child;
Identifying community resources including housing, financial, transportation, mental health, substance abuse, and peer support services and actively assisting the Indian child's parents or, when appropriate, the child's family, in utilizing and accessing those resources;
Monitoring progress and participation in services;
Considering alternative ways to address the needs of the Indian child's parents and, where appropriate, the family, if the optimum services do not exist or are not available;
Providing post-reunification services and monitoring.

## Agents of Change

Rapport building - demonstrate genuine care and concern

Active listening and acknowledgement of family circumstances.

Ask and answer questions until true understanding has been achieved.

A non-judgmental environment regardless of circumstances.

Client input in case plan. If children are old enough consider their wishes.

Unconditional motivational support - you might be the only one who believes in them.

Providing culturally responsive services. Don't be afraid to learn from your families.

Sharing of all case related information. Communication in a timely manner is ESSENTIAL.

Awareness of services and supports available to assist the family. Stay up-to-date.

Engaging other meaningful adults to assist in the process of making change. The bigger the support system the greater likelihood of success.

Provide training in performing tasks.

Seek overt commitment to task and goals
