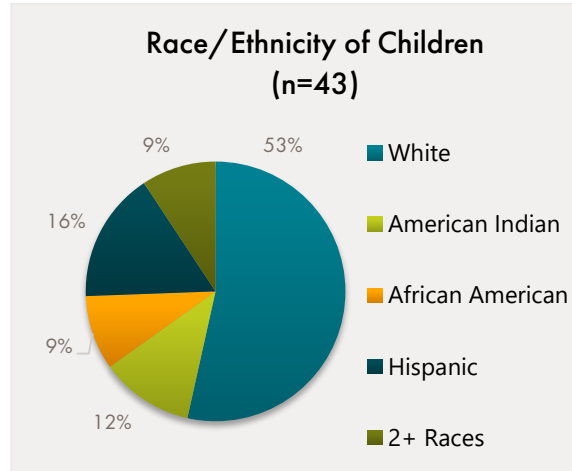
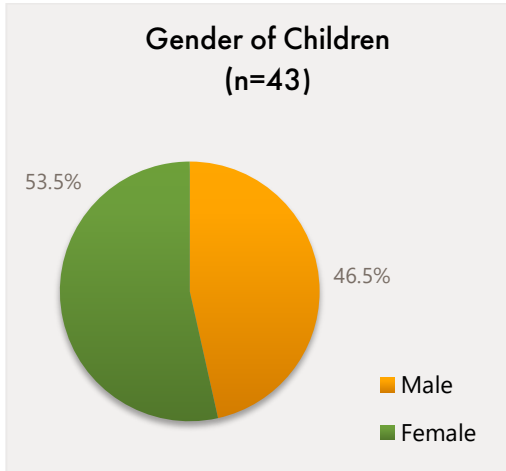
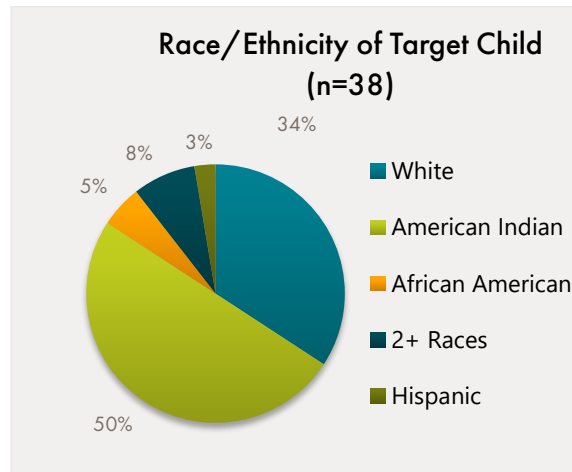
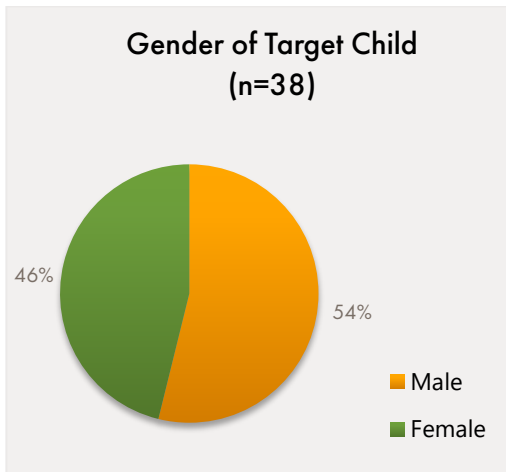


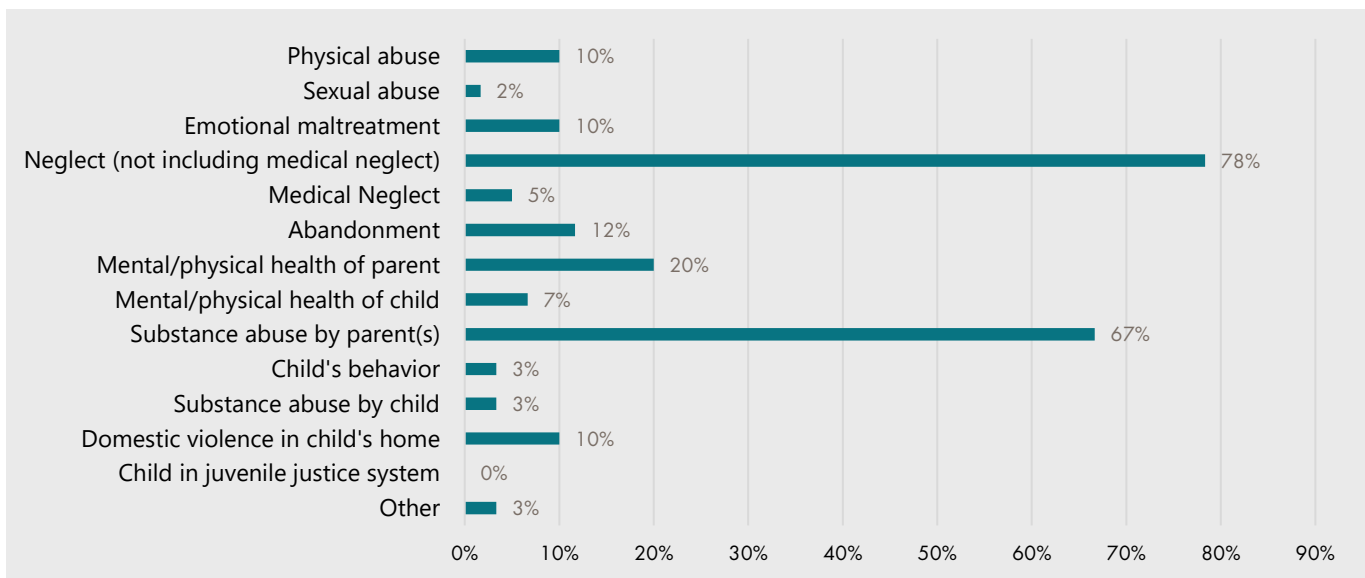
CHILD DEMOGRAPHICS – IN-HOME SERVICE CASES (n=43)



CHILD DEMOGRAPHICS – FOSTER CARE CASES (n=38)



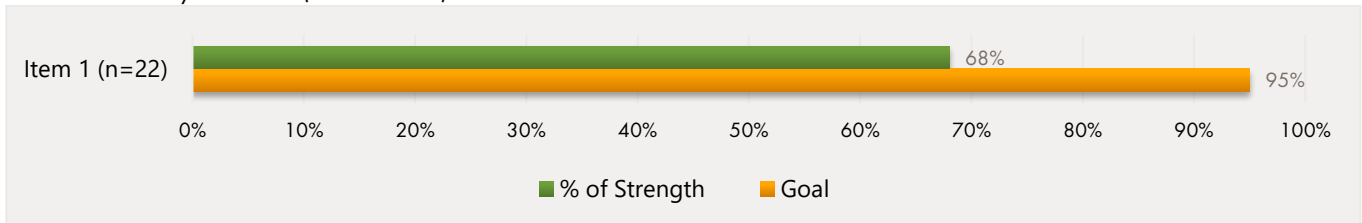
REASON FOR AGENCY INVOLVEMENT – ALL CASES

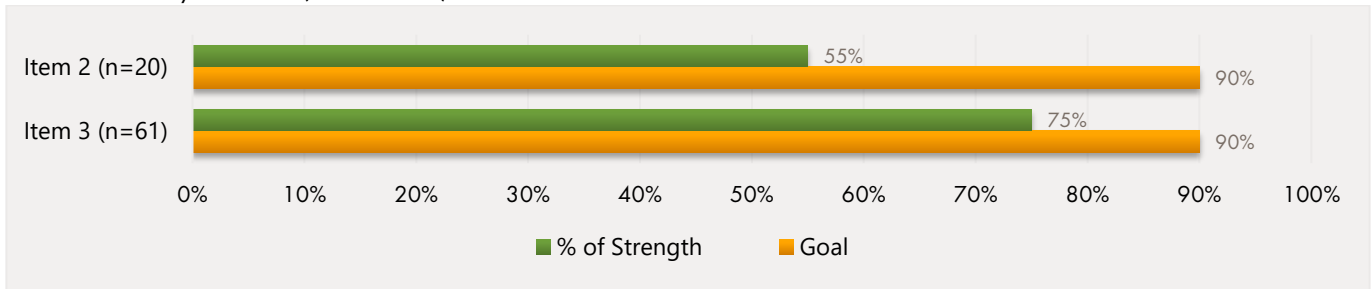
SAFETY OUTCOME 1: Children are, first and foremost, protected from abuse and neglect.

68% Substantially Achieved (Goal is 95%)



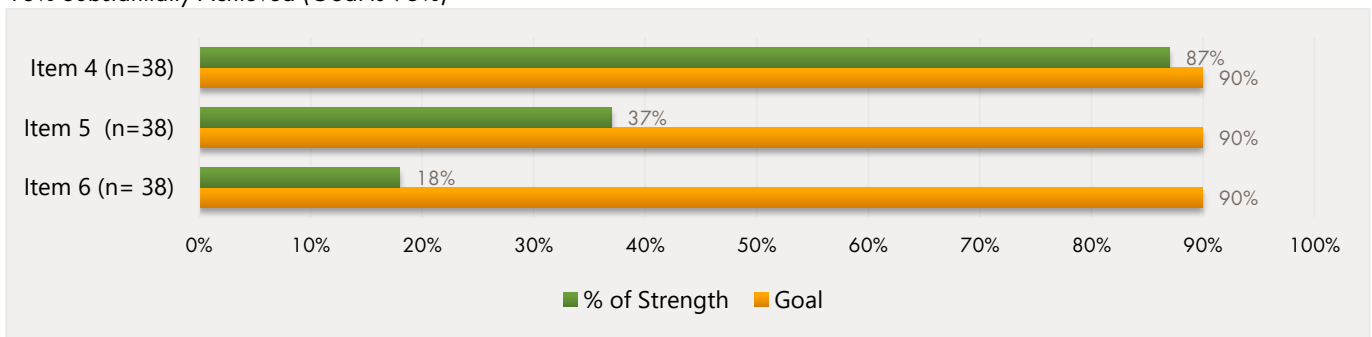
SAFETY OUTCOME 2: Children are safely maintained in their homes whenever possible and appropriate.

74% Substantially Achieved (Goal is 95%)



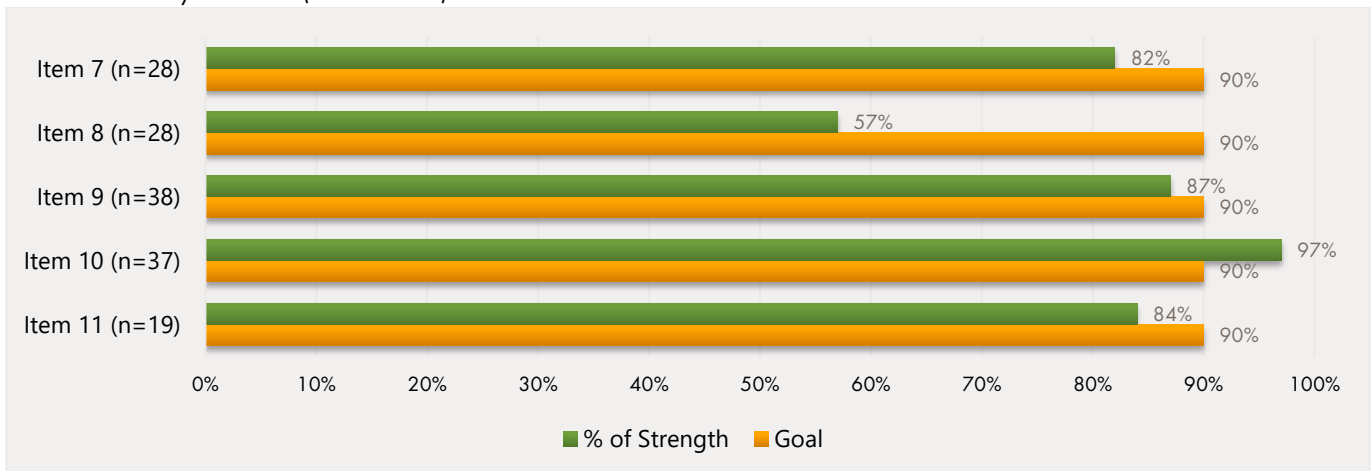
PERMANENCY OUTCOME 1: Children have permanency and stability in their living situations.

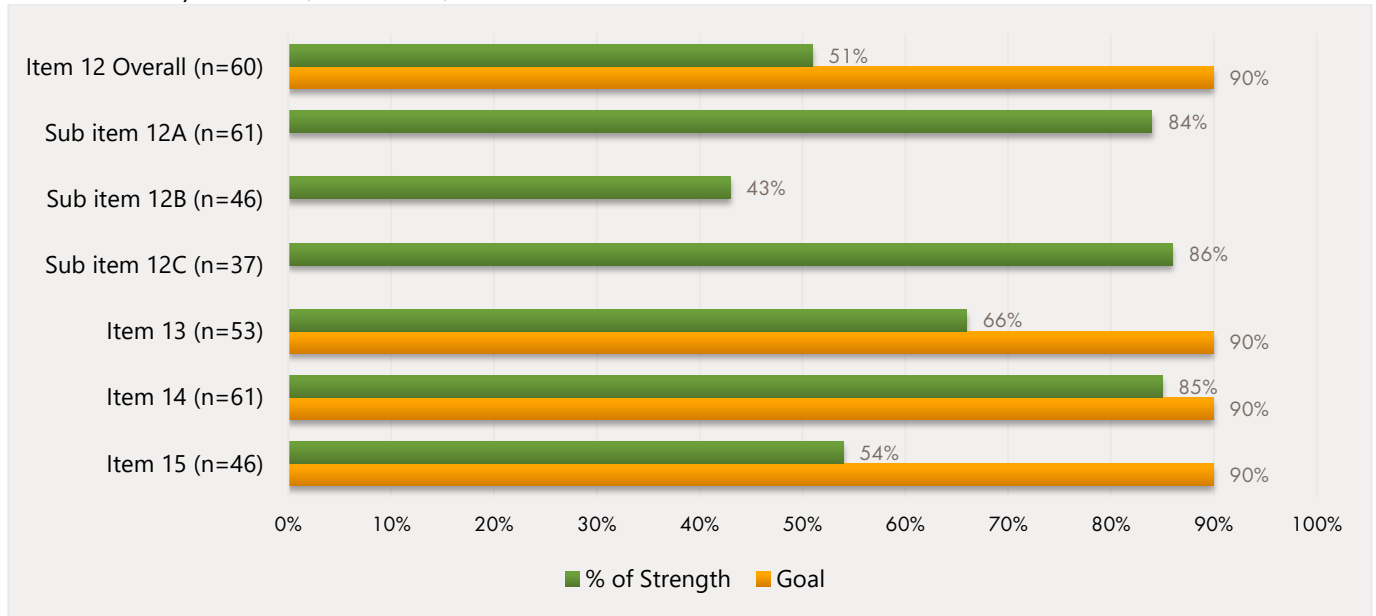
PERMANENCY OUTCOME 2: The continuity of family relationships and connections is preserved for children.

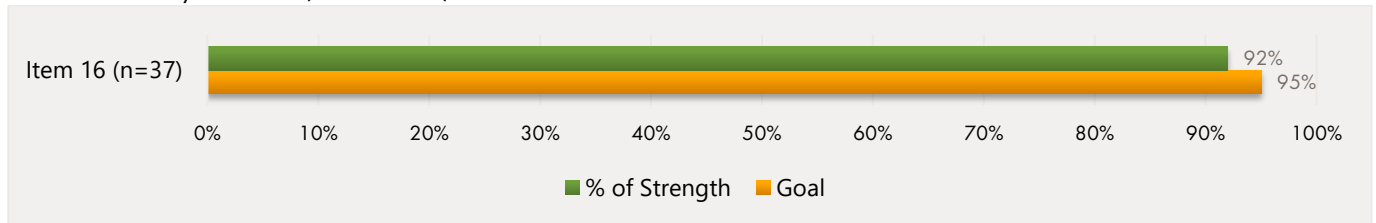
WELL-BEING OUTCOME 1: Families have enhanced capacity to provide for their children's needs.
