The applicant must meet the School of Graduate Studies' current minimum general admission requirements as published in the graduate catalog.

- A four-year bachelor's degree from a recognized college or university.
- Twenty semester credits of coursework in the behavioral sciences at the undergraduate level, which must include theories of personality, abnormal psychology, developmental psychology, and statistics. Additional courses in psychology and sociology may be applied toward this prerequisite. Courses in other social science disciplines where the focus is on the description or explanation of individual or group behavior may be accepted in fulfillment of this prerequisite at the discretion of the department. Applicants must submit this information on the "Supplemental Application Form and Undergraduate Coursework Summary."

- A cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 2.75 for all undergraduate work or a GPA of at least 3.0 for the junior and senior years of undergraduate work (based on A= 4.00).
- Favorable recommendations and the admission committee's perception of the "best fit" based on the applicant's personal statement.
- Satisfy the School of Graduate Studies' English Language Proficiency requirements as published in the graduate catalog.
