We accept both direct admit students (those coming without a master's degree) and post-master's students (those coming with a master's degree). Courses completed as part of a Master's degree in Counseling or Psychology can be transferred for equivalent credit. Courses that generally can NOT be transferred from another program include: Ethics, Advanced Vocational Psychology, Supervision Theory & Techniques; Doctoral Practicum, Practicum in Supervision, Personality Assessment, Cognitive Assessment, Research Issues in Counseling Psychology, Advanced Psychometrics, Professional Seminar I, Professional Seminar II, and Preparation for Pre-Doctoral Internship.
