Players, Rosters, and Substitutions

- Games are played 2v2.
- Teams can consist of 3 rostered players, but only 2 can play in any game.

Equipment/Court Set-Up

- Cups will be set up in a pyramid like setup with one cup at the top, two in the second row, three in the third row, and four in the back row.
- Cups and balls will be supplied by the Wellness Center.
 - These will be the only acceptable equipment for competition. No personal equipment will be allowed unless granted by RecSports Staff.
- Cups will be set up approx. 27 ft. apart.
- Each team will have one player beside each set of cups.
- If teams cannot decide which side they will toss from, flip a coin to decide who chooses.

The Game

- Matches will be played best 2 out of 3.
- Every match is first to make all the cups of the opposing team
 - All balls should be thrown during an attempt of offense
- When throwing the ball, a player must not step over the foul line (the front of the cups).
- The player or team that scores the most cups will throw first on the next rotation
 - If neither player or team scores, the player or team who pitched first in the preceding rotation shall retain first pitch.
- Players can attempt to throw the ball any way they like
- Players must pitch all of their balls from their designated side of the cups for the entirety of the game.

Scoring

- Pong will be played until every cup has been made and removed from a teams side
 - If a team makes both balls into the same cup, the opposing team will remove an additional 1 cup of their choosing

Miscellaneous

- Games will be self-governed.
- The winning team will report the score to the RecSports staff member that is working
